

### Year 11 and 13 Dazzle in the summer

As always, a rather nervous aspect of the summer holidays for teachers, pupils and parents are the two Results Thursdays in August. Full of pride, we as a school were delighted with the results that reflect the amazing resilience, hard work and skill of our Year 11s and Year 13s.

This year we gained the highest amount of 7-9 grades at GCSE (equivalent to A and above) and the Year 13s, owing to their excellent grades, have gone off to their favoured destinations. These results resulted in over 140 students gaining places at university and many others starting highly reputable jobs and apprenticeships. The percentage of top grades again in Year 13 was our best yet, with over 67% of our students gaining A\*- C in their final examinations.

We are very excited about the next steps for our ambitious and very hard-working young people.

### Super-curricular Round up

One of our main aims within the Academic pillar is to provide as many enrichment opportunities outside of the formal curriculum as we can. We are very lucky that the relationships that we have built up with external organisations give our pupils some unique experiences. In particular, this term the research cooperation







with Langton Boys has meant that our sixth formers are working on a number of unique and university-type projects:

Science - Biology and Astro Physics project

History - Researching the Red Dean of Canterbury - Archbishop in the 1920s

English - Looking at the works of Chaucer and Shakespeare

Similarly, this term 50 pupils from Years 9 and 10 participated in the Youth Summit conference at the University of Kent. This was a series of lectures and workshops on a range of topics that one might choose to study at university. Again, the response from our students and the feedback from the staff at Kent made us very proud that our students

### **Team Sport Update**

Hundreds of Canterbury Academy students have represented the school across a range of sports this term. Our netball teams have benefitted from specialist coaching on Monday afternoons and have performed well in district fixtures this term. We are also launching a team for our Sixth Form students which will provide a great opportunity for our older students to play competitive sport for the school. All of our football teams have successfully negotiated the early rounds of the Kent Cup and there have been some strong performances in the district league. Several players have made The Canterbury District u14 squad which is an excellent achievement considering the strength of local football. Well done to Thiago Ferreira, Zac Keeble, Jack Fenton and Efe Kurt of year 9.

Our Sixth Form rugby side have bonded very quickly and have won their first three fixtures, demonstrating excellent team work and high levels of skill at times. This side has daily training as part of our unique Sixth Form sporting provision and anyone interested in what we can offer for committed sports students should contact us on sport@canterbury.kent.sch.uk We also have a Sixth Form Open Evening taking place on Tuesday 8th November.

Our under 17 cricket side fell at the final hurdle in the National Cup when they were defeated by Shrewsbury School via the Duckworth-Lewis method which calculates winners after abandoned matches. Despite this setback, the school cricket programme featured in national sports reports in the Daily Telegraph and on Sky Sports News. One of our players, Jaydn Denly, won the Kent Cricket Academy's Outstanding Player of The Season Award for his performances for county teams this summer.







### **Primary School Initiatives**

The Canterbury Primary School have benefitted from a series of specialist cricket coaching sessions run by our School Games Organiser, Chris Kidd. He has been supported by members of our Sixth Form cricket side and the sessions have utilised innovative Root Academy coaching equipment. This initiative is part of a special partnership we have signed with The Root Academy to develop cricket in primary schools.



Currently, our primary school pupils are also benefitting from sessions in boxing, gymnastics, basketball and football. There are some fantastic opportunities for sport across our whole campus and the offer at the primary school has been outstanding this term.

The Canterbury Academy Sports Partnership hosted a district handball competition on Tuesday 4th October. 15 local primary schools took part in a tournament that was enjoyable to play in and featured some high-quality skill. Our sports leaders from year 8 and 9 did a fantastic job with Isaac Little being particularly impressive.

### **Specialist Provision**

Our sport scholars have begun some work in the gym with our full-time strength and conditioning coach. This programme is reserved for those students competing at a high level outside of school and features county representatives in cricket, squash, rugby and triathlon. They receive support for their sport. This year's cohort includes Ollie Scott, Romilly Evans, Amber Clarke, Gaia Jennings, Harry Fulton, Findley Linch and Jacob Meredith.

Record breaking numbers of students will be taking part – it promises to be an extravaganza!



Girls, we are SO proud of you and excited for what is about to come. Well done!



\*The additional 15 hours will be available to families where both parents are working (or the sole parent is working in a lone parent family), and where each parent earns, on average, a weekly minimum equivalent of 16 hours at national minimum wage or national living wage, and earns less than £100,000 per year. An eligible child can receive this entitlement from the academic period after their third birthday until they start reception class at school.
