

At the same time some 14 educational years later, our Year 13s have triumphed with their resilience and academic ambition through university applications. This year we have crossed the 200 UCAS application landmark. It is quite simply inspirational. Primary School projects

The Academic pillar aims to be relevant to all parts of our Trust Academy.

Since January 17th 2023 we have been able to send our Year 7 pupils to the bookshop with their English teacher. This will continue until all 239 pupils have participated in this reading adventure.

Super-Curricular Round Up

At the end of this term, all three university scholarship programmes in Years 8, 9 and 10 will have had their first two days of academic challenge.

For Year 8 a visit to the University of Kent kicked off the programme and a day in school pursuing the Davinci challenge whetted their academic appetite.

For Year 9 they visited The University of Kent and Christ Church focusing on what it means to study one of the big five subjects (law, medicine, architecture, engineering and languages).

Year 10 are now spending their time on their final presentation for the programme on what the journey entails to achieve a career in one of the big five areas.

As always, our programme of events outside the formal lessons is prioritised to give pupils the connection to the curriculum, but also to enthuse them about potential careers and further destinations.

Launch of the Brilliant Club-Round three.

We have fallen in love with the Brilliant programme and have signed up our third cohort of Year 9s this January. This cohort will focus on STEM subjects and a study of **why the planet does not implode.** The launch took place at Magdalene College Cambridge University, where our 14 pupils learnt about super- curricular skills, how to study SMART and learnt from undergraduates the process for applying to a top British university.

This is targeted at Year 9s and again allows pupils to engage with research and the writing of a 5000-word essay. They have weekly seminars with a PhD expert and learn the skills around source evaluation, referencing essays and promoting an argument at a very academic level.

Global Sport Achievement for Canterbury Academy Cricketers

Two of our Year 13 students have just returned from South Africa where they have been competing in the inaugural under 19 World Cup. It's the first time the best U19 cricketers have come together from the women's game to compete in an ICC Global Event. Alexa Stonehouse represented England in the tournament and Darcey Carter played for Scotland. Both girls would have learned a lot from an incredible experience and Alexa's team made the final which was broadcast live on Sky Sports. Unfortunately, England lost that final to a very good Indian side but Alexa's performance with the bat and ball had helped her team win a tense semi-final with Australia. Darcey's team were very much underdogs and faced the might of India and Australia in their group games. The Scotland team fought bravely in all of their games and finished the tournament by beating The USA in their final match. Darcey got some important runs at the top of the order and fielded brilliantly across the tournament.

This is an exceptional achievement for both girls and we hope it leads to even better things for them. They have extensive commitments involving regular trips around the country to train and play which makes balancing their studies challenging at times. Thank you to their teaching staff for the flexibility both girls have been provided this year and well done to both girls for the level of commitment they have shown this year.





Kent Rugby Success for Max Campbell

Congratulations to Year 13 student, Max Campbell, for an outstanding rugby season with Kent's U18 team. The team were triumphant against Surrey, Hampshire and Sussex and the coaching staff complemented the entire squad on it's commitment and togetherness. We are delighted by the progress made by our rugby students this term. 
'Afterlife' at The Canterbury Academy, 21st-23rd February 2023

After Life is set in a holding bay between life and death, where the recently deceased have a week to grapple with the question:





at both our Canterbury settings. This is an extension of the free early education and childcare entitlement for eligible 3 and 4 year olds from 15 hours to 30 hours a week.

*The additional 15 hours will be available to families where both parents are working (or the sole parent is working in a lone parent family), and where each parent earns, on average, a weekly minimum equivalent of 16 hours at national minimum wage or national living wage, and earns less than £100,000 per year. An eligible child can receive this entitlement from the academic period after their third birthday until they start reception class at school.

This will initially run as a trial for a limited number of places, so please call us for eligibility criteria, to arrange a tour of our setting or book your place.
