

We have run lots of after school clubs this term and it has been great to see so many students getting involved in new activities on the athletics track and out on our unique beach courts. Volleyball and athletics have been popular and our after-school cricket club has helped introduce the game to some younger students. As always, Kent Crusaders basketball training provides a great opportunity to develop fitness and skills in an enjoyable environment after school. Several fixtures have been disrupted by torrential rain, but the highlight of the term has been the success of our year 7 rounders team. The girls have played really well and beaten some strong schools.



Year 7 student, Ashton Platts, has excelled himself through his continual dedication to his swimming. Ashton competed in his first ever South East Regional Gala this term. Despite being very nervous, he qualified in the gruelling 200 metre butterfly and then swam brilliantly to win his heat claiming a personal best and moved up towards the top 10 in his age group across the region. This is a fantastic achievement and demonstrates what hard work can lead to.

Two other hard-working students are our Appeti Tennis School players, Ludovica Bartelli-Jones and Ashleigh Hannah. Both girls have performed well this season and represented the school at a county competition in Bromley this term. They lost in the county final against a very strong pairing. Ashleigh won a Grade 3 tournament over the Easter break. She played at Finchley Manor in London and not only did she win the under 14 event, without dropping a set, she also was runner up in the under 16 age group in a very close final. Ludo has just officially gone up to the under 14 competitions and has already won two tournaments at that age group.

Junior Football Achievements

For many years, The Canterbury Academy have had strong links with Gillingham Football Club. Ex-student, Alex Giles, is on the verge of signing a contract with the club. Year 8 student, Henry Broster, has had a great season with the Gillingham Under 13 team. He was recently voted Player of The Year at the end of season award ceremony. Henry has also received exceptional feedback about his commitment to school studies demonstrating that he can balance his sport with his learning. His subject staff have been very complimentary about his attitude to work.

Mia Dixon continues to excel in football and her hard work has been rewarded with a place in Arsenal's under 16 programme. This means she will be training alongside players who are two years older than her, and it is rare for Arsenal to do this, but they have been so impressed with her development, that they are keen to challenge her next season.

Success in Sixth Form Sport

Our Sixth Form sport programmes provide exceptional coaching and opportunities for committed sport students to compete at district, county, regional and national level. The hard work that so many of our Sixth Form students put in on a daily basis is paying dividends since The Canterbury Academy has enjoyed more success this term. Our football side won the East Kent league this season following on from their county cup success last year. Our athletics students all performed fantastically at the county championships this term and every athlete achieved a personal best with Chloe Link and Daisy Meenan gaining bronze medals in the 100 metres and 200 metres respectively. This is an outstanding achievement considering both girls excel in other sports. Year 12 student, Chloe, has actually been selected to represent Great Britain at The European Judo Championships in June and recently claimed a gold medal at The English Open. Harrison King won a junior triathlon in East Grinstead, shaving seven seconds off his personal best in the process.

Our senior cricket side have been playing regularly despite a disrupted schedule due to the poor weather. The team successfully defended The Cricketer 100 Trophy out in Desert Springs, Spain, at Easter. They went through the tournament unbeaten and defeated Shenfield School from Essex convincingly in the final. Since then, they have lost a tight game to Tonbridge School and beaten Whitgift School in a friendly. They remain in two national competitions and have gone unbeaten in the county league.



An exciting development has been the launch of our new netball academy which will kick off in September, 2023. We have already had lots of interest in this and lock forward to socing the players develop next year. For

on Dorothy's magical ruby slippers. To make it home safely, Dorothy must learn an important lesson: there's no place like home!







