

Collectively, pupils and staff at the Academy gave back nearly 4500 hours of their time to improve or enrich the school, community and others. This year's Community Week was a phenomenal demonstration of the true character of the pupils and staff of The Canterbury Academy.

During the last week of term, years 7-10 took part in a day each of giving back to others, their community or the environment. Activities included revamping our onsite garden, which had fallen in to disrepair. The groups that worked on this have transformed the area in to a welcoming outdoor space, now complete with a small pond! We're even hoping to be able to use some of the vegetables being grown for school dinners!

Other activities included pupils planning and leading sports sessions with pupils from local primary schools- Wincheap, Parkside, Pilgrim's Way and Canterbury Primary School; creating and reading lift-the-flap books to pre-school children at City View nursery; making and delivering baked treats for Blue Light Workers across Canterbury; litter picking around our community, walking thousands of steps towards Blean, Chartham, Toddler's Cove and Thanington; supporting Kent Wildlife Trust with habitat management in Blean Woods; building planters for care homes; bringing performances to people in the Westgate Gardens; creating and handing out friendship bracelets and cards to primary school children and members of the public; creating artwork to decorate our new library and humanities department; creating crafts and planters for a new forest school area being created at City View nursery and putting on a picnic for the children there.

















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
