

Academic Awards Extravaganza

The most exciting experience for teachers is seeing students achieve and realise their potential or goal.

On Wednesday 8th November the Academic Awards Evening was such an occasion. Amidst the distinguished guests including the Lord Mayor, governors, sponsors, academic staff from our two partner universities and a video clip from Rosie Duffield, we celebrated 74 students across the Trust for their very significant academic progress, achievement and resilience. Awards were shared from all the departments.

One particularly important accolade was the Carpe Diem Awards for a select few. These awards were for pupils who had either managed a number of very difficult hurdles on their academic journey or had achieved phenomenal success. These were shared with students with outstanding GCSE and A level results despite continuous medical issues, students who are presently at some of the top universities in the world as well as Primary School and City and Coastal pupils who have risen to the challenges of pushing themselves to achieve.

Once again, the evening underlined the key part of our DNA at the school-celebration of all the talents.

STEM celebration and lots of frozen flowers

For years there has been a desire to increase the exposure in schools to STEM activities (Science, Technology, Engineering and Medicine), primarily because there is a lack of well-trained students in a number of STEM-related careers and professions.



In week 4, our first STEM week this academic year, organised by the school's STEM leader, Mr Jacob, started to tap into enthusing our pupils in these STEM areas. Aided by the very generous and exciting science department from the University of Kent STEM week allowed over 200 pupils from the primary and secondary school to experience Liquid Nitrogen workshops and engage with electronics. It was very exciting to see pupils realise the importance of these subjects and be part of a number of stimulating experiments.









Desirable Destinations- reach for the stars

Each year we guide our students in the Sixth Form through the process of positive destinations. Within the Academic pillar we are sending hundreds of students off each year



to very impressive higher education destinations. One of the favourable destinations is Cambridge University, still highly competitive and still ranked one of the best universities in the world.

So, it is very noteworthy that this year we have 4 students applying to study at Cambridge next year. We are delighted with their high aspirations and their success to date. They are looking to study Sociology, Computing and Engineering.

Impressive Achievements Across Sport

Year 10 student, Aston Young, became a junior world kickboxing champion in mid-November. He beat Belgium's Achraf Boujadaini at the Hero of the Hall show in Chippenham earlier this month. His opponent was slightly heavier and had a height advantage which made the fight increasingly challenging for Aston. However, an aggressive strategy coupled with excellent technical execution, helped Aston dominate his opponent throughout the seven rounds.



After the final bell, the judging panel crowned Aston as the WRSA Junior World Champion.

Aston's success is obviously well deserved and demonstrates the importance of commitment and sacrifice. We look forward to seeing how he progresses in the next year or so. Aston is a member of Falcons Kickboxing Club in Margate.

Four of our students have recently been recognised for excelling in their sport outside of school. Three of our Sixth Form rugby players have been selected to play for counties this season. Isaac Divine is this year's 1XV Captain at The Canterbury Academy and he is a player who leads from the front, and is well respected by all his team mates and coaches alike. Isaac is a main stay in the Thanet Wanderers 1st Team Colts squad and always one of the first names on the team sheet. This year, Isaac has been selected for the Kent U18 squad in a much-contested position of back row and will be looking forward to the County season starting in December, with the potential of further honours at Divisional level



Ollie Jordan-Smith is an inspirational fly half with excellent game management skills who can also play full back and centre when called upon. He was recruited for Ealing Trailfinders Academy last season whilst playing for The Canterbury Academy, and has played in all the Academy fixtures to date against South Africa Titans, CUBA and more recently Edinburgh Reivers, where they remain unbeaten. Selected for Middlesex on the back of his game against the Titans, Ollie started all Middlesex U17 games at Fly Half last season and was voted Man of the Match against Hampshire and Joint MoM against Devon. In his last year as a member of the Canterbury Colts 1XV, he is looking forward to the coming campaign with Middlesex U18's, where he also is looking for Divisional honours.



Finally, Lilly-inger Philpott represented Kent under 18 against Essex and performed exceptionally in a game where Kent fought back from 19-0 down to claim a 19-19 draw. Lily has worked tirelessly in our athletics academy where she receives support for her rugby through specialist strength and conditioning sessions.





Year 9 student, Henry Broster, has been selected for Kent Schools Football Association under 14 team and played a key role in a 3-2 win against Hampshire in the national cup, which means Kentprogress to the quarter finals. Henry was voted under 13's player of the year last season for Gillingham, and he is enjoying this season in the under 14's. Henry is part of our under 14 football side who advanced into the latter rounds of the county cup this season only to be beaten narrowly by Harvey Grammar School.



Middle school students, Emily Drake and Jasmine Davids took part in the North Foreland Junior U14 badminton doubles tournament at Ursuline College and played very well demonstrating fantastic resilience and determination during the competition. They finished the tournament as runners up, but they only lost to the winning pair by three points.

Millie Clewes competed in Great Yarmouth in the Winter Solos for artistic roller dance and achieved her first gold medal. Maya Stavi, also won gold at a British championships in her age and weight category in the sparring category with Matt Fiddes Martial arts.

Basketball and Netball Teams Hitting the Heights

Our Sixth Form basketball academy run in partnership with The Kent Crusaders have performed brilliantly this term and the team are progressing well in their final EABL campaign. Impressive wins against Barking Abbey and Copleston mean they are in a strong position heading into the New Year. Tim Oboh, Shem Onadeko, Max Bignell and Ludlow Henson have all performed strongly for the side. An exciting development will see us launch a programme specifically for girls next September. 
'A Night at the (Christmas!) Movies at The Canterbury Academy




Frozen at The Gulbenkian!




Canterbury Primary School raised £750 while at the Academy £1773 was raised. The grand total was £2523.27
