- The Cambridge Roadshow visited the school. Over lunch, Year 11s and 12s had a Q and A session with un dergraduates from Queen's College.

With this in mind, we are delighted with the number of applications and diverse offers that we have for UCAS and higher education. Football News

Congratulations to The Canterbury Primary School football team who remained unbeaten all season and clinched the double by winning the district league and cup. An under 15 girls' side from The Canterbury Academy won a game 9-0 against Archbishops this term. Our under 13 girls' team won a game against Barton Manor 8-1.

Junior Rugby Continues to Shine

The Canterbury Academy provided plenty of rugby opportunities this term. Specialist coaching has been provided to a select group of players by Canterbury Rugby Club and a whole host of players have represented the school in the district festivals run this term. Our year 7 team went unbeaten in one tournament and each year group had success in different festivals. Year 7, 8, 9 and



10 have all entered two development tournaments each, held by our colleagues at Queen Elizabeth's Grammar School (QES) which have been superbly attended by schools across the district. Mixed Fortunes in Kent Crusaders Basketball Campaigns

Our Sixth Form basketball team finished third in the EABL Southern Conference meaning they had to travel to the North-West to play Myerscough College in the national quarter-finals. The team lost out 72-68 in a nail-biting game that became very close. Head Coach, Adam Davies commented on the performance. "I am super proud of the players, staff, and programme for what we have achieved. To be in the top eight nationally is only accomplished through commitment and hard work. We also couldn't do it without the support of the teachers and school."

Lower down the school, the basketball talent pathway appears to remain promising. Our under 16 and under 14 school teams have both advanced into the latter rounds of county competitions. The under 14 team beat Rainham Mark 72-38 to advance to the semi-finals and will play Langley Park. The under 16 team beat a very good Maidstone Grammar team in a close quarter-final that ended 84-82 and then defeated Gravesend Grammar 79-68 in the semi-final.

Yet again, it has been an incredibly busy and productive term for all of tour primary schools who sign up to be part of The Canterbury Academy Sports Partnership. We ran a district cross-country event at Chartham Primary School which was very successful. We hosted a cricket Rapid Fire event at The Canterbury Academy where local primary schools took part in some developmental cricket activities run by Kent Cricket's community team.

We have also provided specialist support to some local primary schools by upskilling their staff with sport based strategies to help pupils with varying sensory requirements. We also ran basketball and cricket workshops for primary pupils after school as part of our Making Winners initiative.

Sixth Form Music Academy band Akadem




Sixth Form Music Academy band Akadem played in heat four of the 'Sound Clash' competition at Olby's in Margate.


Careers Fair for KS3
